Pinnacle Loft
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Description

This western red cedar two storey loft house is situated at the base of the pinnacle walking track. It offers picturesque views and is a great place to come and relax.

It is suitable for one large family or two small families.

There are 4 bedrooms, one is located upstairs and has its own ensuite, three on the ground floor. There are 2 queen size beds and 4 single beds. The main bathroom has a spa bath and a separate toilet.

A fully equipped kitchen and laundry also help make this place like a home away from home.

Wood Heater

The wood for the heater is located in the shed. Wood is NOT to be used for outdoor fires. If there is no kindling please source sticks from around the yard. When starting the heater, lift the small lever with the knob on it located on the bottom right hand side of the heater all the way to the top. This promotes air flow and will help the fire burn better to get it started.

As the fire gets established and is burning freely gradually slide the lever down to the bottom. This will allow the heater to burn more efficiently.

The fan switch is located on the right hand side at the base of the heater. You may need to plug it into the power point at the rear of the heater. Fan promotes air flow around the heater and thus allows the house to heat up quicker.

DO NOT use axe or hatchet inside the house! This breaks tiles. Use the log outside the garage to split wood. Use the log on the deck outside the house to chop sticks and kindling.



Gas BBQ

The gas BBQ is provided for your use.

PLEASE BE CONSIDERATE OF OTHER GUESTS WHO WILL BE STAYING AFTER YOU AND CLEAN IT AFTER YOU USE IT - NO ONE WANTS TO USE A DIRTY BBQ.

There is a spare gas bottles in the shed if you run out of gas, please swap the bottles and leave a note for the cleaner or advise us via email or phone that you have done so.

Electric Heater/Air Conditioner

There are two reverse cycle air conditioners, one located upstairs and one downstairs. They are remotely controlled. The remote for the downstairs system is located near the stairs and the one upstairs is located behind the bed head.

Hot water

A large hot water tank is located on the right side of the house. Hot water is heated between 10pm - 7am. Please note, there may be an hour shift to this time, due to the daylight savings or other reasons. If you are experiencing a lack of hot water supply, please check the hot water fuse is turned on. This is located on the electrical switch board, on the front, right side of the house. We have had instances where guests switched the fuse off, before leaving the property.

Please **DO NOT** switch off any fuses, when vacating the property.

If the fuse is on and you are still having issues with the hot water supply – this is possibly because previous occupants have used up all of the hot water, before your arrival. If this happens, you can enable the hot water booster. The button is located on the hot water switch. Press it and the booster will heat up the water during next 20-30 minutes.



Garbage collection

Could visitors please place the rubbish/recycle bins out on the side of the road on a Sunday night for collection on a Monday morning. Recycle bins only go out fortnightly so please check if the neighbors have placed theirs out to know which week to put it out. Place the bins slightly apart.

Departure

Renting a vacation home as opposed to hotel comes always with a little extra responsibilities for guests. Our business leaves these responsibilities to our guests:

- Please check-out by 11am at the latest (unless arranged with the owners)
- Please wash and dry all dishes and put them away
- Please remove all items from the refrigerator and clean it
- Please empty bin and place all rubbish in the wheelie bin outside
- Please ensure the air conditioners are turned off
- Please ensure the beds heating blankets are turned off in all the bedrooms
- Please ensure all the lights are switched off
- Please check all the doors and windows are locked
- Please wipe the BBQ down with newspaper and make sure it is clean
- Please turn off the television
- Please make sure the shed is locked and key returned to the hook above the refrigerator

Bushfire Plan

Halls Gap is a bushfire prone area. On days of High Fire Danger:

- Listen to local radio stations for weather and fire updates:
ABC RADIO 3WV 594 AM
ACE RADIO 3WM 1089 AM
- Take note of any warnings given.
- Modify your activities to suit the weather conditions
- Check for total fire ban days:
(Halls Gap is in the North Western Fire District)

In case of bushfire in the proximity of Halls Gap or the Grampians Region:

- Listen to local radio stations for fire warnings and instructions
ABC RADIO 3WV 594 AM
ACE RADIO 3WM 1089 AM
- Check www.cfa.vic.gov.au
- Check www.dse.vic.gov.au/fires
- Ring the Victorian Bushfire information line on 1800 240 667
- Call in at the Halls Gap Visitor information Centre or ring for advice on 5361 4444
- Relocate to a safe location if necessary
- Contact your hosts
- Halls Gap has a nominated Neighborhood Safer Places (NSP's) or place of last resort:
Halls Gap Information Centre — Grampians Road, Halls Gap
- NOTE: You should only make the decision to go to a NSP if all other options of escaping the fire have been exhausted.
- Going to a Place of Last Resort is an option of last resort when other plans have failed.
- Places of Last Resort are not an alternative to planning to either leaving early or staying and actively defend your property.
- They are not inherently "safe" places during a bushfire.
- Many houses will provide more effective protection than Places of Last Resort.
- Travelling to a Places of Last Resort may be dangerous. Traffic congestion, fire activity, heavy smoke, accidents or fallen trees may block the route there.

- There is no guarantee that you will not be injured or killed by fire or radiant heat when travelling to or sheltering at a Place of Last Resort.
- While emergency services will make every effort to protect people sheltering at Places of Last Resort, there is no guarantee that emergency services will be present.
- There will be no provision for pets.
- There will generally be limited parking. Large numbers of vehicles may further compromise what little protection the area affords.
- No amenities (eg. food, drinks, toilets) will be provided

Halls Gap has two main roads for access or egress:

- Grampians Road, northwards to Stawell.
- Grampians Road, southwards to Dunkeld.
